- (1) The 1♠ was answering a question about the last hand.
- (2) The Old One felt it but couldn't be sure. She was having a bad night so what could she lose with a double header?
- (3) Aunt Fanny only ever redoubles for take-out playing with suckers.
- (4) North didn't know what had been redoubled and was scared to ask.
- (5) The Old One took a quick look around the table. North was expressionless being rigid with fear. West was smiling broadly and madly thoughtwaving East into passing while Aunt Fanny looked quite nonchalant but was feeling for her Sal Volatile. The Old One decided West was a bigger moron than North and missed a 2000 penalty.
- (6,7) This was Aunt Fanny's night and she knew it.

West thoughtlessly led ◆J and the Old One committed harikiri at trick 1 by passing it instead of taking and leading a spade or trump. A club was led and the Old One gave a twist to the sword by switching to ♠A. South ruffed with ◆4 and led a second club.
