Since 3S would be forcing, the choice is to pass 3H or bid 4S. Hoping for a little more in with partner like the HA, the CQ and a couple of spades, I went for the bigger result. In practice 4S went three down and 3H would have the same outcome. That was -150 for -3 Imps against the datum of N-S 60.

3NT showed a flat game raise. I do better to pass but 4♣ seemed OK when Jill led a trump. Terry won and returned a ♥. No point in playing the ♥Q but I won dummy's A, a mistake. I took the ♠ finesse, played a ♣ to the K then ran ♠s and ♠s but that was no good. If I duck the ♥9 at trick 2, the strip squeeze works. Win the ♦ in hand, cross to the ♣K for the trump finesse then run trumps and ♠s to reach this ending.
