

Board 18 of Session 4 of the Stage Two saw most North-Souths playing in 6 ◆ or 6NT.

Only three pairs across the field found the making grand slam. All three were in 7 → and I was interested in how they got there. As it turned out, they all took different paths.

Paul Lavings and Tony Leibowitz used the most steps. The auction was:
