I asked some leading players their tips for the Interstate Teams Events. Michael Wilkinson from NSW selected NSW to win all four—Open, Women's, Senior and Youth—a feat never previously achieved. He admitted to being a "statriotic"

A trend had been developing so I asked two Western Australians who bucked the trend. " I couldn't honestly tip any of our teams to win with great confidence—but we're hopeful" I was told.

### Open


NSW have a very strong team of three top pairs and their NPC, Nye Griffiths, is going for a rare treble—he won the event as a player for ACT in 2007 and for NSW in 2008. The team to beat. 
