WELCOME TEAMS

Two members of the New South Wales Open Team, Pauline Gumby –Warren Lazer combined with Lyn Kalmin –Lorna Ichilcik, New South Wales Women’s Team representatives, taking out the six-round event in great comfort. They scored 126 out of 150 VPs, to finish well ahead of second. This deal from Round 6 was interesting, even though it was one of the team’s worst results:

The contract was 4♥ by East at both tables. At one table 4♥ was down, while against Lazer – Gumby, the EW pair made 4♥ for a total of +720 to the opponents.

Despite winning the last match, there was a serious discussion about how 4♥ can be made—and defeated—after the score-up.

At one table Lazer, South led a club to Gumby’s ♣K and ♣A, and a third club was ruffed high. Declarer now played the hand on crossruff lines, giving up a diamond and scoring five trump tricks in hand, three trump tricks in dummy, and the side suit aces: 10 tricks.

To succeed, the defence has to arrange to lead trumps twice, without establishing ♦Q as a trick. This involves North switching to a trump after cashing only one top club. If North cashes a second club, this gives declarer an extra entry to hand to ruff spades. South needs to play low if declarer

plays ♦A and another, allowing North to ruff, then continue with another killing trump. A pretty testing defence, one might say!

The line at the other table involved drawing trumps and trying to set up diamonds, which resulted in one down.
