BUTLER DAYS

I was unwell for the first day of the Butler, (blame it on the beef?) so my reporting today focuses on Day 2, Sunday. The match overleaf features two sterling pairs, but I first want to bring you a deal where an imaginative defence led a very experienced campaigner astray:

Open Butler, Round 7, Board 6, East deals, EW vulnerable

Kim Morrison, who reported the hand, was North, declaring 4♠.

His opponents were father and son combination from South Australia, Bill and Alex Lockwood. Lockwood Senior led a club to Alex's ♠A, and Morrison ruffed the club continuation.

He played a heart to the king and another back to the queen and his ace. He continued with two top spades, on which Alex played ♠6 and ♠J, retaining ♠7. Declarer then took a ruffing finesse in hearts, running ♥10 to Alex's ♥J. Yet another club brought this end position about:

"Knowing" East held the last spade, which was lower than dummy's spade, and not being able to afford to play a diamond towards dummy, Morrison started to play his established hearts.

Alex was able to ruff in with the trump he couldn't hold, and the game was one down, when several pairs made 12 tricks on the deal.

On Day 2, I took a seat behind Matt Mullamphy as he and Ron Klinger took on leaders at the time Pauline Gumby—Warren Lazer.

The diagram above is the score from the match; let's look at the major swings.

Nine tricks are easy looking at all four hands, but Mullamphy led ♥K, and Lazer ducked. He shifted to a tricky ♦8.

Lazer thought long and hard before going up with ♦A. He took the ruffing finesse through Klinger, discarding a heart, and now lost a diamond, a heart, a club and two spades when the defence was able to score two trumps tricks independently, Mullamphy leading a third diamond to pro-

mote his second spade honour when Lazer ducked a first round of spades to him: 4 IMPs to NS.

On the next board, Lazer—Gumby won the partscore battle, when it was possible for NS to score game:

1. Puppet to 3♣, a weak way of showing support here
As can be seen from the datum sheet, keeping NS out of game was worth only 3 IMPs, as it is hard for South to judge that the hand will provide so many tricks—both in hearts and a club ruff. The defence to 3♣ took the obvious five tricks.
The next hand is included because Ron Klinger asked me how some had bid the grand slam. In our feature match, only the small slam was bid.

This auction, from Table 28 in the Open was a good one; West took control and found the grand slam easily once it was known that ♠K was such an important card. I like it better than the Lazer—Gumby auction, where after opening 1♣ on the East hand, Gumby reversed into 2♦, making it more difficult for Lazer to recognise the full worth of his ♠K.

Sorry, guys, I can't find my notes from the match (surprise, surprise, those of you who know me say) so I can't remember whether Klinger doubled 2♣ at his second turn or bid 3♣. Suffice to say that when questioned, Gumby affirmed that Lazer's 3♣ bid showed the values for a 3♠ advance, and Klinger's final double of 4♠ showed his doubt that Lazer was correct. 9 IMPs to NS when Lazer lost a trump, a heart, a heart ruff and a club (the diamond loser went away on the established heart). 9 IMPs NS in a match won by NS 18-13 IMPs.
