

Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory

The Museum holds pride of place overlooking the harbour, with a number of permanent galleries as well as travelling exhibitions, a gift shop and the Cornucopia Cafe. There's a permanent Aboriginal Art Gallery and a must-see exhibition of the NT's marine environment and fish life. Of particular note is a real (but stuffed) crocodile called Sweetheart - approximately 50 years old and over 5 metres long!

Back in 1974, Darwin was wrecked by **Cyclone Tracy**. Get a sense of what it would have been like to live here and experience such devastation. There's a special room! The sound is eerie, scary and probably just a bit too real.

The other current exhibition, '*Gone Fishin'...The Reel Top End story*' explores how fish and fishing tell the cultural, scientific and social stories of the Northern Territory.

For cheap food (and real Darwin culture) on Thursdays (and Sundays) visit the Mindil Markets, boasting the tastes of 5 continents in over 50 food stalls. Territorians and visitors alike enjoy having dinner on the beach watching the sunset, then attacking the market stalls.

The markets are located on Mindil Beach (just beyond the Skycity Casino) and 3km from town - starts at 4 pm.
